Steveston Highway multi-use pathway

Construction of a new off-street multi-use pathway along the south side of Steveston Highway began on August 22, 2023. Beginning at Shell Road, the pathway will be built in five stages working west toward No 2 Road. This is part of the City and Regional Cycling Network Plan and part of the Community Energy and Emissions Plan to achieving net zero emissions by 2050.

The anticipated completion date is late summer 2024.

Metro Vancouver in Stage 2

Due to a dry summer, water restrictions are in place until October 15. These are supported and enforced by the City through Richmond's Water Use Restriction Bylaw. Violating the restrictions could result in fines of \$200 or more.
