Fireworks Regulation Bylaw 7917 is in effect in Richmond and prohibits the possession, sale, purchase or ignition of any fireworks, of any kind, at any time in the City of Richmond, except with special permit.

Community Bylaws Officers will be actively enforcing the bylaw. Persons found to be selling, igniting or in possession of fireworks are subject to fines of \$1,000 under the bylaw.
