The Auxiliary Constable Program

The Auxiliary Constable Program operates under the authority of the Police Services Division of the Ministry of the Attorney General. The mandate of the Auxiliary Constable program is to strengthen community and police partnerships. It provides an opportunity for citizens to perform authorized activities that address the cause of and/or reduce the fear of crime and disorder.

Auxiliary Constables participate in a number of community-based events and assist regular police officers in the field under supervision.

What is the role of an Auxiliary Constable?

Auxiliary Constables promote community-based policing by participating in events that may include:

- Assisting in CPTED - Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design
- Home and Business Safety Checks
- Block Watch Meetings
- Crime Prevention Displays
- Police Presence at Special Events Through Foot and Bike Patrols
- Personal Safety Presentations
- Traffic Control
- Assisting Regular Police Officers with General Duties.

Training

Auxiliary Constables must complete a six to eight month training program. The training will include, but is not limited to:

- Basic Law
- Police Procedures
- Community Policing Concepts
- Effective Presentation Skills
- Foot Drill
- Handcuffing
- Self Defence
- First Aid

Written and practical exams will be administered at the end of the training program. Candidates will be assessed throughout the training and must successfully complete all aspects of the training to be eligible for graduation.



Basic Requirements

- Minimum 19 year of age
- Canadian citizen or landed immigrant
- Minimum high school diploma
- Possess a valid class 5 BC drivers license with a clean driving record
- A resident of the City of Richmond
- Physically fit
- Be of good character
- Proficient in either of Canada's official languages
- Willing to commit a minimum of 160 hours annually
- Willing to commit to the program for a minimum of two years.
