When to Call the Police

If you discover a crime in progress, call 9-1-1.

If the suspect has left, or if someone has attempted to break in, do not touch anything and call the Richmond RCMP non-emergency number at 604-278-1212.

Report all criminal activity to the Richmond RCMP. If a suspect is present, call 9-1-1. If no suspect is present, call the Richmond RCMP non-emergency number at 604-278-1212.

Write down the suspect's description: sex, race, height, weight, clothing and vehicle details, direction of travel, vehicle description and licence plate number.

Why Call the Police?

If you do not report relevant information on a specific crime, the crime may never be solved or it may increase the length of time it takes to solve it. Many people hesitate to call the police, but the police need and want your help in preventing crime. Do not assume someone else has already called the police. Your information is important! Investigating crime is like putting together a puzzle and your piece of the puzzle could be vital. If someone breaks into your car or your house, calling to report the crime is important because a suspect may have been arrested with stolen property that belongs to you.
