A new artificial turf sportsfield will be constructed inside the track facility at Minoru Park.

Agenda Items:

1. 3900 Moncton Street (DP 06-352004) Andrew Cheung Architects Inc. – To permit the construction of a two-storey mixed-use development at 3900 Moncton Street on a site zoned "Steveston Commercial (Two-Storey) District (C4)"; and to vary the provisions of the Zoning and Development Bylaw to: (a) increase maximum building height from 9.0 m to maximum 10.06 m for false front parapets; (b) reduce the minimum parking setback from 1.5 m to 0.45 m to the south property line and from 3.0 m to 1.0 m to the lane; (c) permit 30% of off-street parking spaces to be for small cars (7 of 24 total parking spaces); and (d) reduce the minimum number of off-street parking spaces from 28 to 26 spaces (24 parking spaces provided).

2. 9071 & 9091 Williams Road (DP 07-377055) Matthew Cheng Architect Inc. – To permit the construction of nine (9) townhouse dwellings at 9071 and 9091 Williams Road on a site zoned "Townhouse District (R2-0.6)"; and to vary the provisions of the Zoning and Development Bylaw to: (a) reduce the minimum front yard setback from 6.0 m to 5.0 m for the buildings and to 4.17 m for porch projections; (b) increase the maximum lot coverage from 40% to 42.7%; and (c) allow tandem parking spaces in three (3) of the nine (9) townhouse units.
