 The City has contracted Columbia Bitulithic Ltd. to grind and pave the following locations in Richmond from September 20 to October 11. Hours of work will be from 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

- 6,000 Block of Williams Road
- 5,000 Block of Granville Avenue
- 5,000 Block of Francis Road
- 5,000 Block of Garden City Road (South bound lanes only)
- 10,000 Block of Aintree Crescent
- 10,000 Block of Ainsworth Crescent

Traffic will be reduced to single-lane alternating at times, and may be subject to temporary lane closures. Every attempt will be made to minimize disruptions; however, delays may occur.


The use of an alternate route is strongly encouraged. Residents are reminded not to park vehicles in the immediate area during paving.

This work is weather dependent and dates are subject to change without notice.
