Agenda Items:
1. 9340, 9360 and 9400 Cambie Road (DP 08-430877) Oris Development (Cambie) Corp. – To (1) permit the construction of a residential development consisting of 251 units distributed among three (3) separate six-storey mid-rise apartment blocks, as well as approximately 176.40 m² (1,888 ft²) of indoor amenity space, together with a daycare space in a two (2) level building of approximately 6,800 ft² (632 m²) at 9340, 9360 and 9400 Cambie Road on "Area A" of a site zoned "Comprehensive Development District (CD/196)"; and (2) vary the provisions of the Zoning and Development Bylaw to: (a) increase the proportion of allowed small car parking spaces permitted from 70% to 78%; and (b) reduce the side (west) yard setback to 3.0 m for the compactor/recycling room.

2. 10671, 10691 and 10711 No. 5 Road (DP 08-440200) Centro Southwind Properties Ltd. – To (1) permit the construction of 21 two and three storey townhouse units at 10671, 10691 and 10711 No. 5 Road on a site zoned R2-0.6D; and (2) vary the provisions of the Zoning and Development Bylaw to: (a) reduce the side-yard setback for the rear dwelling units from 3 m to 2 m; and (b) reduce the side-yard setback for the

front dwelling units from 3 m to 2.4 m at the northern property line and from 3 m to 2.9 m at the southern property line.

Dog licencing for 2009 It's important for many reasons



Beginning in November, invoices, to renew dog licences for the 2009 calendar year, will be mailed to dog owners who have previously licensed their dogs with the City.

The benefits of licencing your dog include:

- It provides identification, allowing us to return your dog to you sooner, if lost or stolen
- It provides statistics on the number of dogs within our community
- It supports the Richmond Animal Shelter and other animal related programs within our community

Each licence fee will reflect any discounts available up to February 28, 2009. Payment instructions are included with the renewal and we encourage you to use Canada Post or the drop off boxes to make your payment. Renewal decals will be mailed to your home within two to four weeks of receiving your licence fee.
