This presentation is presented in partnership with the Vancouver Biennale. It takes place:

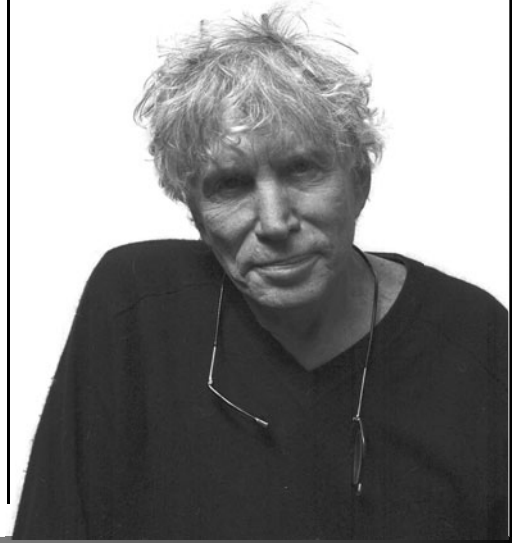

His installations in the 2005-2007 Vancouver Biennale, Device to Root Out Evil and Engagement were two of the most popular and controversial installations. Engagement was acquired by the Biennale as a Legacy work. Device now resides temporarily in Calgary.

This talk will be preceded by a short performance by Kellarissa (Finnish for "in the basement"), the solo project of Vancouver-based Mint recording artist Larissa Loyva.
