## Summer watering restrictions

Until September 30



Richmond residents are reminded of the lawn watering regulations that are in effect throughout Metro Vancouver. From June 1 to September 30, lawn sprinkling is allowed only from 4:00 - 9:00 a.m.

and 7:00 - 10:00 p.m. on the following days:

- Even-numbered addresses can sprinkle Wednesdays and Saturdays
- Odd-numbered addresses can sprinkle Thursdays and Sundays

A healthy lawn only needs 2.5 cm of water or to be watered for one hour, once a week, or less if it rains. And while these watering regulations apply only to lawns, residents and businesses are encouraged to think about other ways to conserve water, especially during the peak demand period of summer.

One way to conserve water and be environmentally sustainable is through the City's rain barrel program. Rain barrels are used to collect and store water collected from your roof runoff. Rain barrel water can be used to water your garden, wash outside surfaces and wash your car.

Purchase your rain barrel at the City's Recycling Depot (Richmond residents only.)
