- field of study of Richmond residents 15 years and over.


## Educational Attainment

The 2021 Census enumerated the highest level of education completed for residents 15 years or older. Permitted responses included certificates, diplomas, or degrees from high school, trade and apprenticeship programs, and college and university.

For each individual ( 15 years and over), the 2021 Census enumerated major field of academic study. The major field of study is defined as the main discipline or subject of learning. It is collected for the highest certificate, diploma or degree above the high school or secondary school level. Fields of study were classified according to the Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) Canada 2021.
