LET'S RECYCLE CORRECTLY!

The following are a few tips to safely recycle household items that are not accepted in Blue Box/Cart recycling.

If there is contamination in the recycling – items in the wrong bins, unaccepted materials or recycling bundled in plastic bags – these materials will not be accepted at processing facilities and go in the garbage. Hazardous materials pose safety risks to collection staff and can be a fire hazard. **The following items are not accepted in Blue Box/Cart recycling. Please recycle them using drop-off programs.**



Electronics such as computers, monitors, printers, televisions and radios are are accepted at Return-It depots. (www.return-it.ca/electronics)



Non-packaging plastics like bags, over wrap, toys, hangers and laundry baskets are accepted at the Richmond Recycling Depot.



Styrofoam like take-out boxes, cups, meat trays and packaging are accepted at the Richmond Recycling Depot.





Cell phones and batteries are hazardous items if not recycled properly. Please recycle them at the Richmond Recycling Depot.



Hazardous liquids like paints, solvents, pesticides and gasoline can be recycled at the Richmond Recycling Depot.



Propane tanks are hazardous items. Please return them to Richmond Husky service stations or the Vancouver Landfill.

WHAT'S IN THIS GUIDE?

Richmond offers a variety of programs and services to make it easy and convenient to recycle. This guide highlights each program and provides tips on how to recycle.



GARBAGE CART

Biweekly curbside collection of household materials that cannot be recycled.



LARGE ITEM PICK UP

Scheduled curbside pick up of four household items per year. Call 604-270-4722 to arrange pick up.



GREEN CART

Weekly collection of food scraps, food soiled paper and yard trimmings.



BLUE BOX/CART

Weekly collection of mixed packaging containers, mixed paper and glass jars and bottles.



RICHMOND RECYCLING DEPOT

Free drop off of Styrofoam, appliances, batteries, cell phones, plastic bags and overwrap, etc. Sale of residential compost bins and rain barrels.

Tips on proper preparation of recyclables and resources for hazardous material disposal.

GARBAGE CART COLLECTION

Biweekly curbside garbage collection is provided to residents in single-family homes and some townhomes. For townhomes with private garbage collection, this information may not apply. Please contact your building or property manager for information.





WHAT GOES IN THE GARBAGE? NOT MUCH!

The more we recycle, the less we need to throw into the garbage. The following are examples of some household items that go into the garbage:

- Diapers & baby wipes
- Broken ceramics & broken glass
- Plastic cling wrap
- Plastic cutlery
- Chip bags and candy wrappers

*There are also some hazardous materials and other household items that must be taken to drop-off locations for safe disposal. See the Tips and Other Disposal Options tab for more information.



GARBAGE CART TIPS



ONE CART PER HOUSEHOLD

Carts are provided by the City and annual fees for curbside garbage collection are based on cart size.



BIWEEKLY GARBAGE PICK UP

Place garbage and recycling at the curb by 7:30 a.m. on your collection day, **every other week**.



SAFE STORAGE

Please return all of your garbage and recycling containers to their storage location by 9 p.m. on collection day.



ADDITIONAL GARBAGE

- Garbage Tags and Garbage Disposal Vouchers are available for purchase at all City facilities.
 For addresses and phone numbers, please visit www.richmond.ca/garbage.
- Garbage Tags: \$2 each for each additional garbage bag/can.
- Garbage Disposal Voucher: \$5 each, value up to \$25 at the Vancouver Landfill (one per household per year).
- Large Item Pick Up Program: Curbside pick-up of mattresses, furniture, etc. See Large Item Pick Up tab for information.

GARBAGE CART EXCHANGE: If you would like to exchange your current Garbage Cart for a different size, or if you require a new Garbage Cart, either due to loss, damage or you are a new resident and your Richmond home does not have a Garbage Cart, please call 604-276-4010. The cost to exchange a Garbage Cart is \$25. Your curbside collection fee will be adjusted according to the size of your cart.

CURBSIDE COLLECTION FOR LARGE HOUSEHOLD ITEMS



Richmond's Large Item Pick Up program provides convenient curbside collection service for up to four large household items per year, including mattresses, furniture and appliances.

This program is designed to make it more convenient to dispose of large household items and to help reduce illegal dumping. Through this program, large household items that can be recycled will be diverted from the landfill, which will help Richmond achieve its goal for 80% waste diversion by 2020. Large Item Pick Up is currently provided to residents in single-family homes and townhomes with City Garbage Cart and/or Blue Box service.

STEPS ON HOW THE PROGRAM WORKS:

- To schedule collection of up to four items per year, residents can contact the City's service provider, **Sierra Waste Services at 604-270-4722** or schedule online at www.richmond.ca/largeitem.
- Sierra Waste Services will contact you to provide a pick-up date and confirmation number.
- On your scheduled pick-up date only, place items at the curb before 7:30 a.m. or no earlier than 8:00 p.m. the night before.



SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS

Safety Notice: The item(s) must be able to be safely handled from the curbside in order to qualify for collection. To ensure your mattress or cloth furniture can be handled safely, please keep them dry and mould-free by covering them in a plastic bag. Reuse the bag from newly-purchased furniture or purchase bags from home hardware and supply stores. Water-logged items that become too heavy may not be picked up due to safety considerations for staff.

WHAT'S ACCEPTED AND NOT ACCEPTED?

Each piece of furniture or large item counts as one item. For example, a table and two chairs equals three items. A metal bed frame, mattress, boxspring and separate headboard are four items, and a sectional couch with two parts is two items.



ACCEPTED

- ✓ Furniture (e.g. couch, coffee table, chair, desk, dresser, TV stand, cabinet, table, hutch, crib, high chair, entertainment center)
- Appliances (e.g. stove, dishwasher, washer and/or dryer, hot water tank, refrigerator, freezer, microwave)
- ✓ Flectric lawnmower

- Small household goods, provided they are boxed or bundled and are a reasonable size (one box or bundle is equal to one of the resident's four allotted items)
- ✓ Barbecue (remove lava rock briquettes and/or propane tank)
- ✓ Mattress or boxspring

- ✓ Headboard
- ✓ Bed frame
- ✓ Outdoor furniture (chair, patio table, patio umbrella)
- Weight training equipment (treadmill, elliptical, stationary bike, stair master, weight set)

NOT ACCEPTED

- x Car bodies or parts
- **x** Carpets
- x Gas lawnmowers
- **x** Hazardous waste
- **x** Lumber

- **x** Demolition (drywall)
- x Home renovation (sinks, flooring, doors, windows)
- x Propane tanks

- **x** Tires
- **x** Tree stumps

If your household item is not listed, contact Sierra Waste Services at 604-270-4722 to see if it is accepted for collection.



DID YOU KNOW?

Wet mattresses cannot be recycled and pose safety hazards for lifting, which is why you need to cover your mattresses in plastic before placing them at the curb for pick up.

GREEN CART FOOD SCRAPS AND YARD TRIMMINGS RECYCLING



Food scraps are banned from the garbage, which means they must be recycled or composted. Richmond's convenient options to recycle food scraps and yard trimmings include the Green Cart program, home composting (bins available at the Richmond Recycling Depot), and garden and yard trimmings drop-off services at the Richmond Recycling Depot and Ecowaste.



WHAT GOES IN YOUR GREEN CART

ACCEPTED

- ✓ Breads & pastas
- ✓ Coffee grounds, filters, tea bags
- ✓ Egg & dairy products
- ✓ Fat & grease solids
- ✓ Fruits & vegetables
- ✓ Food-soiled paper towels, napkins, paper plates & pizza delivery boxes
- ✓ Microwavable popcorn bags
- ✓ Meat, poultry, fish, shellfish, bones & table scraps
- ✓ Rice & noodles
- Small amounts of cooking oil that can be wiped up and absorbed with paper towel or newspaper
- ✓ Yard trimmings & grass clippings

NOT ACCEPTED

- x Compostable and/or biodegradable plastic bags
- x Glass, metal or foil
- x Large amounts of liquid grease or cooking oil*
- x Plastic bags & plastic take out containers*
- x Styrofoam materials*
- * Take to the Richmond Recycling Depot

Do not put fats, oils or grease down the sink, garburator or dishwasher, as this causes build-up and damage to sewer pipes.

GREEN CART TIPS



Place cart at the curb by 7:30 a.m. on collection day and no earlier than 8:00 p.m. the night before.



Please return your Green Cart to its storage location by 9:00 p.m. on collection day.



Use an unlimited amount of paper yard waste bags and/or Green Cans for extra yard trimmings. To order a Green Can sticker, contact Environmental Programs at 604-276-4010.



Ensure branches do not extend beyond the top of the container. They must be less than 4 inches (10 cm) in diameter.



To prevent odours:

- Sprinkle baking soda in your cart
- Wash your can/cart regularly
- Wrap food scraps in newspaper, paper bags or used paper towels and freeze until collection day

GREEN CART EXCHANGE: If you would like to exchange your current Green Cart for a different size, or if you require a new Green Cart, either due to loss, damage or you are a new resident and your Richmond home does not have a Green Cart, please call 604-276-4010. BLUE BOX & BLUE CART RECYCLING

Richmond's Blue Box and Blue Cart programs make it easy and convenient to recycle paper products, aerosol cans, spiral wound containers, milk cartons, plastic/paper drink cups, aluminium foil, tin can, rigid plastic containers and glass bottles and jars. These recyclable materials are not permitted in the garbage.

WHAT GOES WHERE:

Combine all newsprint and paper items into a yellow Mixed Paper Recycling Bag or Mixed Paper Recycling Cart

Glass jars and bottles are recycled using the grey Glass Recycling Bin or Glass Recycling Cart



Plastic bottles, tin and aluminium cans and more recyclable items go in your Blue Box or Containers Recycling Cart











HOW TO GET REPLACEMENT BOXES AND BAGS

There is no charge for new or replacement Blue Boxes, Mixed Paper Recycling Bags, Glass Recycling Bins and Blue Cart Indoor Collection Bags. Boxes and bags are available for pick up at the Richmond Recycling Depot or City Hall. Replacement boxes and bags can be requested by calling the Environmental Programs Information Line at 604-276-4010.

RICHMOND RECYCLING DEPOT

5555 LYNAS LANE – CONVENIENT AND CLOSE TO HOME

The Richmond Recycling Depot is ideal for recycling and drop off of items like large and small appliances, paint, solvents and other materials banned from the landfill. The City is continually expanding the range of materials accepted at the Recycling Depot.



ACCEPTED

- ✓ Empty aerosol & spiral wound cans
- ✓ Batteries & cell phones
- ✓ Cooking oil & animal fat (up to 2, 5-litre containers are accepted)
- ✓ Corrugated cardboard
- ✓ Exercise & hobby machines (treadmills, elliptical & cross trainers)
- ✓ Fluorescent lamps including compact fluorescent lights & fluorescent tubes
- ✓ Glass food & beverage containers
- ✓ Large appliances (fridges, freezers & dishwashers)
- ✓ Large metal items (bike frames & clean barbecues)
- Magazines, including glossy catalogues & flyers
- ✓ Paint, solvents, pesticides & gasoline (restrictions apply)
- ✓ Plastic bags & overwrap
- ✓ Plastic food & beverage containers

- ✓ Power tools
- ✓ Lights & lighting fixtures
- ✓ Sewing, knitting & textile machines
- ✓ Small electrical appliances (toaster ovens & electric mixers)
- ✓ Styrofoam
- ✓ Tin & aluminium cans
- ✓ Used books
- ✓ Up to 1 cubic yard of garden trimmings at no charge for Richmond residents. Each additional cubic yard is \$20. Alternatively, Richmond residents can drop off an unlimited amount of yard trimmings at Ecowaste Industries free of charge. Proof of residency is required. Visit www.ecowaste.com or call 604-277-1410 for hours of operation and directions.

Note: Commercial operators are charged \$20 per yard for all trimmings at the Richmond Recycling Depot.



DID YOU KNOW?

Since 1996, more than 35 million kilograms of batteries have been diverted from landfills. Batteries collected are sent to recycling facilities where they are processed into reusable metals and materials. These are used to produce new batteries, stainless steel products and cement additives. For more information, visit call2recycle.ca.


ITEMS FOR PURCHASE AT THE RECYCLING DEPOT




RAIN BARRELS: Rain barrels are available for purchase. The barrels require a water diverter unit to hook up to the downspout of the water runoff from the roof. Water diverters are available for purchase at hardware supply stores.

COMPOST BINS: Available to residents at a reduced price of \$25 plus tax.





\$5 Garbage Disposal Voucher: Value for up to \$25 in disposal charge at the Vancouver Landfill and are valid during regular operating hours. Limit one per household per year.



Hours: Wednesday to Sunday 9:00 a.m.- 6:15 p.m.

(Closed on statutory holidays)

RECYCLING TIPS

Recycling is easy with these simple tips to ensure proper preparation of your recyclables.



Remove lids, and place materials separately in bins, not stacked or tied in plastic bags. Bagged items will go straight in the garbage.



Line your kitchen container with newspaper, a paper bag liner or used paper towel. Sprinkle kitchen container with baking soda to reduce odours.



Empty and rinse containers and jars to make sure no food is left inside. Recycle glass jars and bottles in the Glass Recycling Bin/Cart. Remove lids and recycle plastic and metal lids separately in the Containers Recycling Cart/Blue Box.



Flatten cardboard and/or cut into smaller pieces. Put shredded paper in a paper bag before placing in the Mixed Paper Recycling Bag/Cart to avoid scattering.



DID YOU KNOW?

Do not put plastic bags, compostable and/or biodegradable plastic bags in your recycling bins. Recycling bundled in plastic bags is not accepted at the processing facility and will be put in the garbage. Food scraps wrapped in plastic bags contaminate the finished compost and are not accepted at the processing facility.
