


Community Mural Program Self-Guided Tour



1. *A Fisherman's Dream*

Steveston Harbour Authority, 3180 Chatham St
This mural depicts the key species of today's local fisheries while paying homage to the glory days of fishing as represented by the silhouetted Gulf of Georgia Cannery on the horizon.

2. *Gillnetter at Night*

This mural was inspired by stories from the Nakashima family who have owned and operated Pacific Net & Twine for 50 years.

18. *Metamorphosis*


