

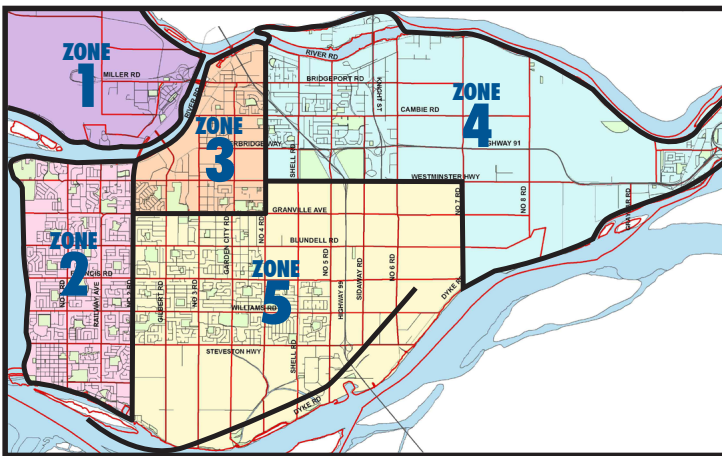

Here are some tips to protect your business against scams **Fraud Targeting Employees**

- Update anti - virus software and ensure computer system is password protected
- Encourage employees to use strong passwords to protect from hackers
- Carefully analysis the sender ' s email address
 - Check with supervisors and management when sending wire money transfer request
 - Establish a procedure for the approval of money transfer
- Limit employee information online
- Inform and train employees about potential suspicious activities that may occur in the business

According to reports from the RCMP, employees are also being targeted. Fraudsters are looking for employees who have authorization to access money to companies. The suspect would gain access to the supervisors email accounts and ask employee to buy gift cards when requested. The RCMP wants to warn the public that this is known as the “ CEO scam ” . Tracing the fraudster is very difficult according to RCMP and such scams is not just limited to gift cards, but also involves money transfer from a company to another account.
