



## Registered Recreational Hockey Visits – FAQs

### **1. What is Recreational Hockey?**

Recreational hockey is a scrimmage (game). Two teams will be divided at the beginning of the ice time. Players take turns on the ice depending on how many have registered. If the session is full it will be 5 vs. 5.

### **2. What is the age for adult recreational hockey?**

Adult recreational hockey is for anyone aged 19 years and older. Staff do ask for valid ID before letting the participant on the ice.

### **3. What equipment is needed?**

Full hockey equipment and a CSA approved hockey helmet are mandatory for participation.

Change rooms will be available to participants 10 minutes before and 10 minutes after to get changed. Showers will NOT be accessible.

### **4. When is it being offered?**

October 12 - 31:

Monday, Wednesday & Friday 12:45-1:45pm

Richmond Ice Centre

Future schedule to be released at a later date.

### **5. How many skaters are allowed on the ice? What is the cost?**

Each session will be capped at 16 skaters including goalies. The cost will be \$6.85 per session.

### **6. Are goalies allowed?**

Yes goalies are allowed to participate. They will need to pay the \$6.85 to hold their spot. Once they arrive at the Ice Centre and can prove that they are attending as a goalie we will credit their account for the \$6.85. Historically goalies have been able to participate at no charge.

### **7. Are there any special protocols for COVID?**

- Arrive no more than 10 minutes before your scheduled time. You will be greeted by a staff member and screened by asking the following questions:



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- Are feeling ill and/or have any of the following symptoms: fever, chills new or worsening cough, shortness of breath, new muscle aches or headache or sore throat;
- Have been in close contact with a person who has a confirmed or presumptive case of COVID-19 within the past 14 days.
- Have travelled outside Canada within the last 14 days.
- Have someone in your house hold that has travelled outside of Canada within the last 14 days
- Maintain a minimum of 2 metres physical distance at all times.
- Change rooms are available 10 minutes before and 10 minutes after your session.
- Upon entering the facility wash and/or disinfect your hands before going on the ice.
- Listen carefully to staff and follow their instructions closely.
- All participants must exit the facility 10 minutes after their session ends.
- Follow directional signage to the exit doors. They may not be the same doors you entered.
- Wash/disinfect your hands on your way out.

### **8. When is registration cut off?**

Participants can register until the session is full. There will be no cut off. This is following the same procedure that is currently being done at aquatics.
