

Jobs in Richmond Hot Facts

Introduction

This issue of Hot Facts examines the number and the occupational categories of Richmond jobs. Jobs within Richmond are those that are held by:

- Richmond workers who live in Richmond;
- those workers who reside elsewhere, but who listed Richmond as their place of work in the 2016 Census.

Statistics Canada provides information regarding the number of workers, their age, gender, occupation and income level. The Hot Facts issue called “*Labour and Mode of Travel to Work*” provides information about labour force activity and work force occupations of Richmond residents no matter where they work. This issue of Hot Facts examines the number of jobs and occupational categories in Richmond held by workers no matter where they live.

Richmond Jobs

The 2016 Census indicates that there are 110,235 jobs in Richmond with a fixed workplace and an additional 8,330 jobs held by those who worked at home. There are also a number of workers in Richmond with no fixed place of work. These include contractors, construction labourers, truck drivers, couriers and taxi drivers. Metro Vancouver will allocate the “no fixed place of work” estimates across all municipalities, and this Hot Fact Sheet will be updated accordingly.

Number of Richmond Jobs by Major Occupation Category

The largest category of jobs in Richmond are in the sales and service occupations (30.3%) and business, finance and administration occupations (18.2%).

The National Occupational Classification (NOC) 2016 is a standardized system used by Statistics Canada in reporting the type of work performed by the population. It groups jobs into 10 broad occupational categories.

Where do people who live in Richmond work?

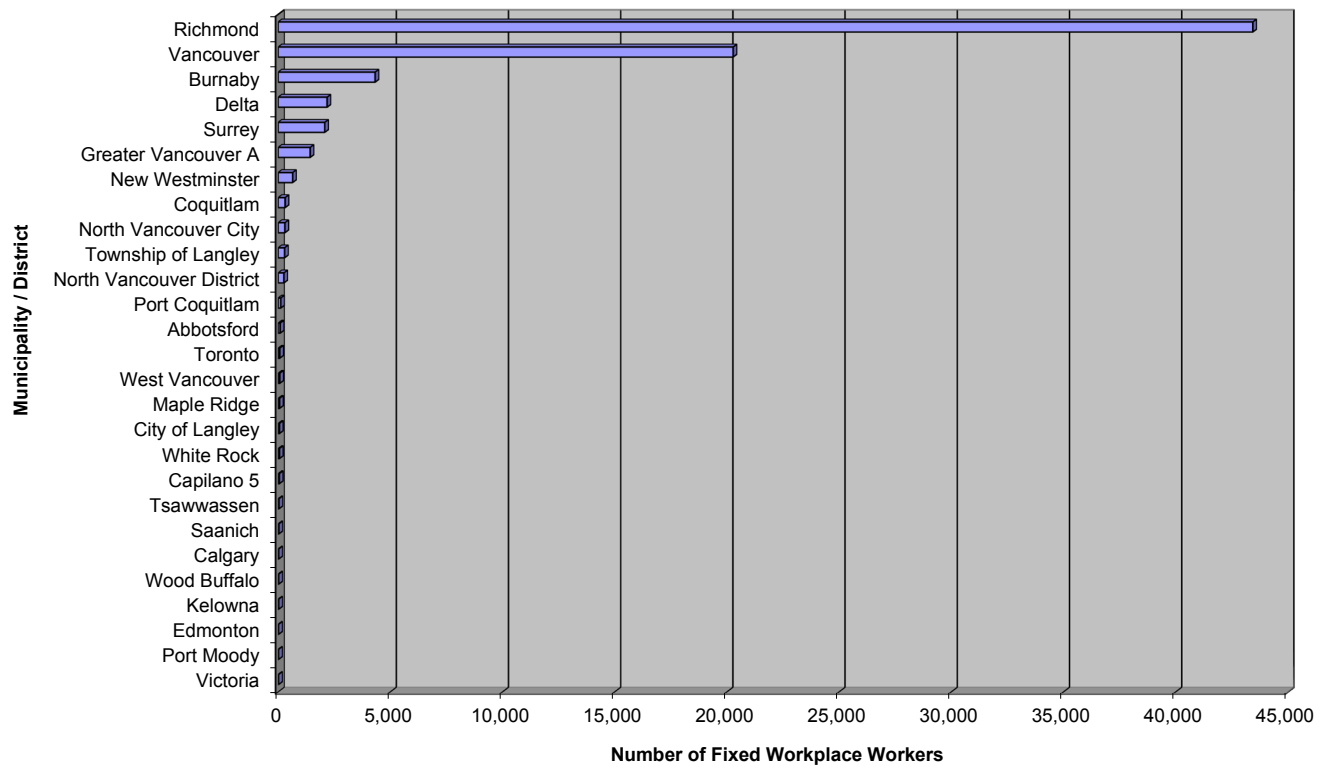
The following table illustrates where Richmond's labour force (those with a fixed place of work) go each day for work.

A large proportion (56.95%) stay in Richmond for work, with 26.58% travelling to Vancouver to work.

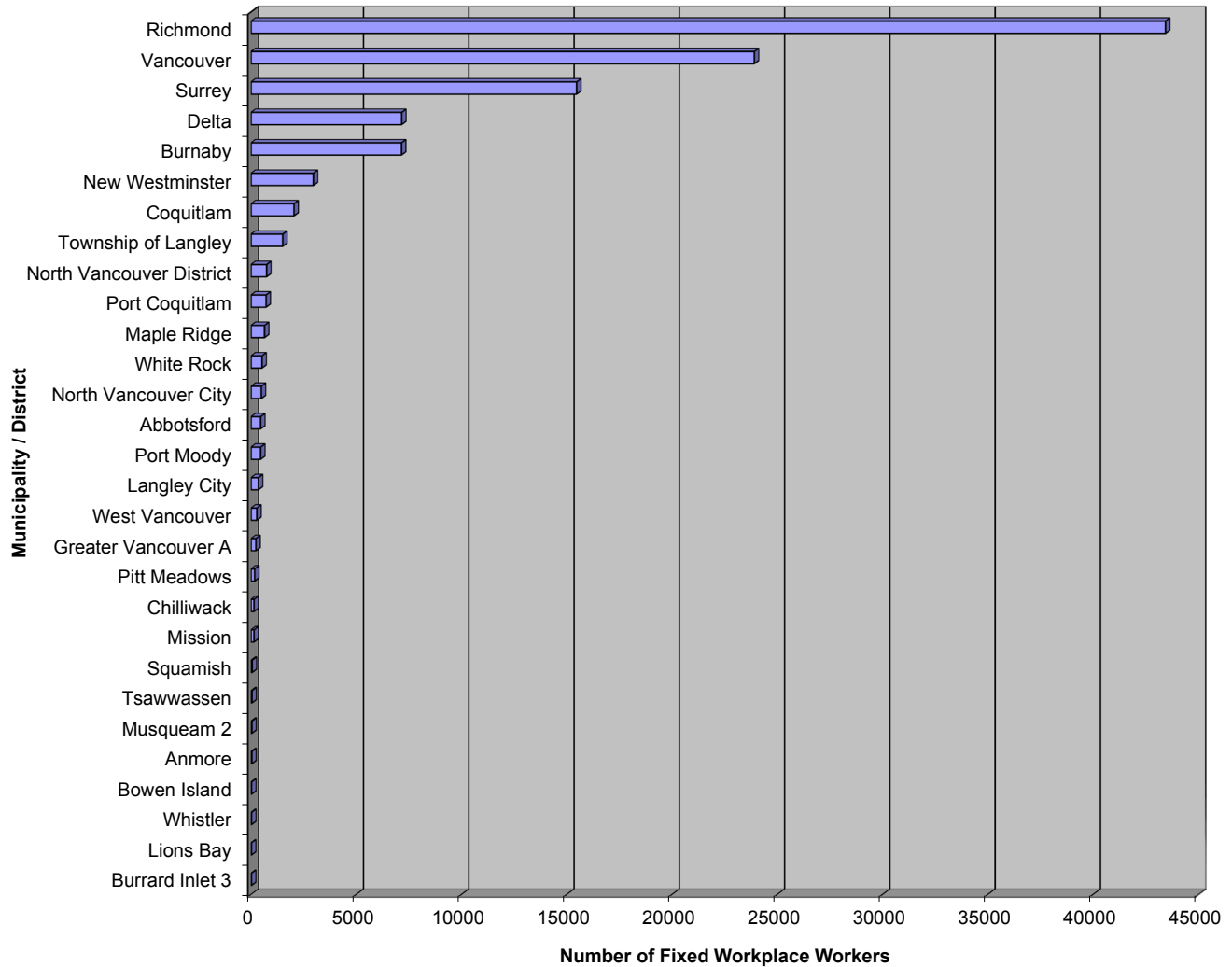
Where do people who work in Richmond come from?

The following table illustrates where those who hold Richmond jobs (with a fixed place of work) come from to work in Richmond. A large proportion come from Vancouver (21.89%) followed by Surrey (14.16%) and Delta (6.55%).

Net Movement of Labour (In and Out of Richmond)

The following table illustrates the proportion of Richmond's labour force that either remain in Richmond to work each day (i.e., fixed place of work) and the proportion of Richmond's labour force that leave Richmond to work elsewhere (to a fixed place of work). Approximately 10,200 more workers stay in Richmond for work compared to those that leave Richmond for work. An additional 66,800 workers who live outside Richmond come to Richmond each day for work. The difference between those workers leaving Richmond for jobs elsewhere and those coming to Richmond for jobs results in a net incoming flow of 33,555 workers coming to Richmond for work.
