Church completed December, 1972. Previously located at 585 Westminster Highway, Richmond - moved through need for expansion. Congregation there from September 1970 - December 1972. Prior to that, two ministries in Richmond-

- 1948 Mennonite Brethren on Mitchell Island to 1964
- Same time, Cottage Missions on No. 1 Road asked Mennonite Brethren to take over work
- Extension work until building condemned 1965 into Westminster Highway building.

## First Building - 585 Westminster Highway

Lot \$ 3,750.00 Building 15,000.00 1970 Extension 10,000.00 - auditorium

- Builder: Peter Penner
- Flat, low building 22' x 29' sanctuary. Nine or ten classrooms. Now used by Richmond Austrian Club.

## Building - 1020 No. 5 Road

(See Dedication Service for Financial Report)

Building functional and modern. Architect - Mr. Rudy

Reimer (Chilliwack). Constructed by congregation. Supervised by John Bargen hiring one full time carpenter and others as needed.

### Congregation

Approximately 170 on rolls. Many more attend services. Primarily of German-Dutch descent, middle-class background.

### Upkeep

"Free-Will" offering and full participation of congregation.
