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Qualifications

- High School graduate and 3 months Normal School in Saskatchewan in 1925 talks of vocational choice and early training.
- 1926 started teaching Grades 1 9 in one-room school, talks of early teaching career and economics in Saskatchewan.

Teaching Methods

- Tells of the project method.
- Doing things with students outside the classroom.
- 2 years university in Saskatchewan.
- After moving to B.C. required to attend Normal School 1941.

Curriculum

- Little difference between 1925 and 1973.
- No real fundamental changes.

Teaching in B. C. 1941 - 1973

- Taught 25 years at remedial school, Surepass School (now Columbia College), coaching students.
- At same time, taught in Richmond.
- Explains teachers salaries.

Richmond High School

- 12 years at what now is Cambie School.
- Remainder, taught at Richmond School on Foster Road.
- Percentage of students participating in extra-curricular activities related to the size of school.
