History of Adult Education Program

- Started under Colonel J. M. Burnett in the fall (shortly after Richmond Senior Secondary School was built.
 - The program consisted mainly of general interest courses examples
 - Difficulty in getting commercial classes
- 1957-59/60 Art Dodd became Director of Adult Education
 - Built program up examples
 - Introduced Dog Obedience course at Cambie High School (course has remained there).
 - 280 students by 1959
- 1959-60 350 400 students under direction of Mr. Lindsay
- 1960-65 Mr. B. Reid became Director of Adult Education
- 1960 10 Physical Education classes at five centres this was the forerunner to the Recreation Commission
- 1963 Academic program started
 - 400 students took part in program of short courses in exam preparation
- 1964-65 Approximately 2000 students attending night school program
- 1965 Mr. Reid became Vice-Principal of Richmond Senior Secondary School
 - Mr. Al Coulson took over night school
- explains the other positions the night school directors had during their term as directors

Name Changes 1952 - Night School Director

- 1963 Changed to Director of Adult Education
- 1973 Changed to Co-ordinator of Continuing Education and Public Relations.
- 1970-71 Principals became involved in night school program to assist the Co-ordinator of Continuing Education gives examples.

Advertised Prior to 1965

- Notices sent home with the students from school.
- Small advertisements in local papers Richmond Review and Marpole Times.

Major Changes 1960 - 1965

- Introduction of academic classes.
- Offering vocational classes.
- Expanded on home economic type classes gives examples.
- Preparation course for government exams.
- First series of speakers brought in from U.B.C. in conjunction with a course.
- Courses for teachers in service.
- Brought in kindergarten teacher program explains.
