EV Charging Expansion

At work, and on-the-go

Currently 4% of all light-duty cars in Richmond are electric vehicles, and this is forecast to grow to 33% by 2030, and 100% by the 2040s. Richmond was the first city to require that all new residential parking spaces have Level 2 EV charging infrastructure. Staff are now drafting similar recommendations for new employee, customer and visitor parking spaces, to widen the options to charge their vehicle at work or on-the-go.

Sturgeon Bank Sediment Project

Phase one complete

Sturgeon Bank, a 5,152 hectare tidal marsh and flats located along the West Dyke, is crucial for Pacific salmon and migratory birds. Since the 1980s, at least 160 hectares of tidal marsh have died off. The Sturgeon Bank Sediment Enhancement Pilot Project aims to restore the marsh by adding Fraser River sediment. Led by Ducks Unlimited Canada, the first annual sediment addition was completed in February 2023. A healthy marsh enhances ecological resilience and mitigates flood risk for Richmond.


