Introduction

- field of study of Richmond residents 15 years and over.

Educational Attainment

For each individual 15 years or older, the 2016 Census enumerated the highest level of education completed. Permitted responses included certificates, diplomas, or degrees from high school, trade and apprenticeship programs, and college and university.

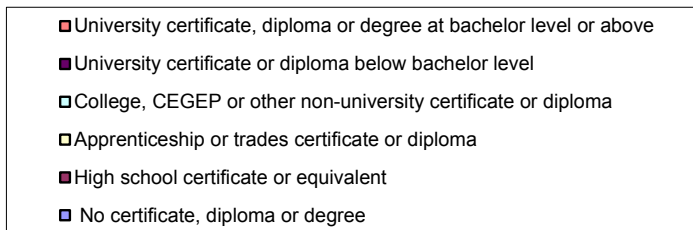
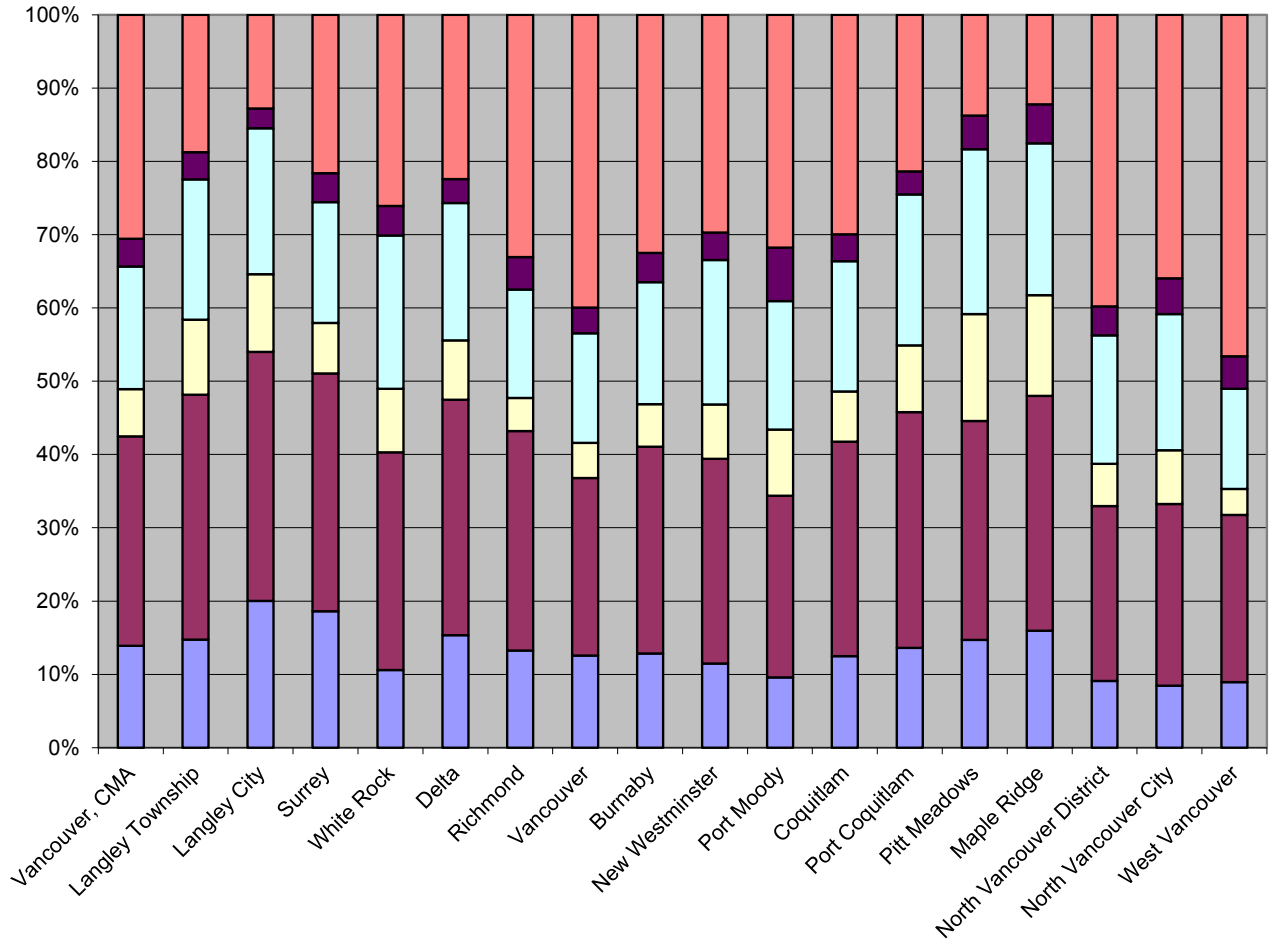

Field of Study

For each individual (15 years and over), the 2016 Census enumerated his or her major field of study. The major field of study is defined as the main discipline or subject of learning. It is collected for the highest certificate, diploma or degree above the high school or secondary school level. Fields of study were classified according to the Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) Canada 2016.
